REMINDER: The Appraisal Standards Board (ASB) and The Appraisal Foundation (TAF) announced that the current edition of the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) will be extended by ANOTHER year. 2020-2021 USPAP will now be effective until December 31, 2023.

Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal (PAREA) provides an alternative to the traditional supervisor and trainee model for experience for licensed residential and certified residential appraisers. Appraisal Institute (AI) PAREA is an online program covering appraisal theory and methodology, in realworld simulations, with mentoring from nationallyrecognized appraisers.

What are some of the key points of the PAREA

The Appraisal Foundation (TAF) created a highlights document. Below are some of the key points:

- It provides an alternative to the traditional supervisor and trainee model.
- Participants complete all qualifying education prior to beginning the program.
- When complete, the participant is eligible for up to 100% of experience credit for Licensed and Certified Residential credentials.
- Individual states can choose to accept all, partial, or none of the PAREA experience
- Participants must complete training on all topics listed in the detailed content outline.

- Participants will receive periodic mentoring throughout, ensuring sufficient demonstration of experience and understanding prior to moving forward in the program.
- Participants will be required to produce USPAP-compliant appraisals within the program.
- Participants, successfully completing PAREA. must also pass the national licensing and certification exam for the appropriate credential level.

When will Al's PAREA be ready?

The AI PAREA program will be ready for participation no later than September 2023.

What is the cost to take the PAREA program? Al will provide the cost once it has been determined. How do I obtain a PAREA mentor?

Mentors will be assigned to participants as part of Al's PAREA program.

How did PAREA come to be an alternative to the supervisor and trainee model?

The Real Property Appraiser Qualification Criteria and Guide Note for PAREA was adopted by the Appraisal Qualifications Board (AQB) on October 16, 2020 and became effective as of January 1, 2021. The exposure draft that led to the adoption of PAREA and the revised Criteria can be found here.

FHA Publishes Updates

On January 18, the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) published its latest version of the *Single Family Housing Policy Handbook* 4000.1 (<u>Handbook 4000.1</u>). This update includes enhancements and revisions to existing guidelines and various technical edits. In many cases, this newly added language augments and enhances existing policy. The updates also consider feedback received from industry stakeholders.

Update 13 includes language to clarify instruction, adds new guidance and information in Sections I, II, III, and IV and Appendix 3.0., and incorporates previously published Mortgagee Letters (MLs).

Handbook 4000.1 updates are effective as follows:

- The Handbook 4000.1 Transmittal reflects the addition of specific ML guidance, which is effective as previously announced in the corresponding ML.
- Changes identified in Section II.A of Handbook 4000.1 may be implemented immediately but must be implemented for mortgages with case numbers assigned on or after April 18, 2023
- All other changes may be implemented immediately but no later than April 18, 2023.

Stakeholders are encouraged to review the changes outlined in the Handbook 4000.1 Transmittal. Additionally, a separate redline version of Handbook 4000.1 has been posted on the Handbook 4000.1 Information Page. The online version of Handbook 4000.1 is currently being updated and will be available soon.

Steinley Starts Term as AI President

Craig Steinley, MAI, SRA, AI-GRS, AI-RRS, of Rapid City, South Dakota, began his one-year term as president of the Appraisal Institute on Jan. 1. Steinley's one-year term as president will be followed by one year as immediate past president in 2024. He also will serve as chair of the National Nominating Committee in 2024.



assessors, golf course developers and managers, and market participants—about the factors that impact golf course and club economics.




