Al Board of Directors Approves Plan to Promote Designations

The Appraisal Institute Board of Directors during its Nov. 9-10 meeting approved an organization brand promotion and awareness plan in which all duespaying Designated Members will have the opportunity to receive a new designation emblem pin or charm that reflects the Al brand redesign. The pins & charms will be available, at no cost, through March 30, 2024.

The pins and charms are marks commonly used by Designated Members signifying their membership with the world's largest professional real property appraisal organization, a tradition that dates to the 1940s. The new pins and charms incorporate the Al brand redesign that emphasizes the organization's mission and values — to empower valuation professionals through community, credentialing, education, body of knowledge, ethical standards, dedication to excellence, professionalism, ethics and integrity, commitment to leadership and innovation, and devotion to an inclusive and welcoming community.

Instructions for obtaining the pin or charm will be provided to Designated Members in the near future.

The Board also authorized the creation of a marketing and awareness campaign that will highlight the value of all Appraisal Institute designations with an emphasis on the SRA designation & the contributions and needs of residential appraisers. Special emphasis will be given to direct marketing and engagement of key users of appraisal services to promote the benefits of hiring AI Designated Members.

In other actions, consideration of the 45-Day Notice that was distributed to AI Professionals on Sept. 25 was deferred to the first regular 2024 Board meeting, which will take place Feb. 22-23.

Al Membership Categories

There are two standard Designated member statuses in the Appraisal Institute: Practicing and Non-Practicing. These two standard statuses contain two different sub-statuses that have certain eligibility requirements and lower dues.

Practicing Designated Member

A Practicing Designated Member is a Designated Member in good standing who is engaged in Valuation Practice as defined by the Code of Professional Ethics. Some Practicing Designated Members may also hold the status of Life Designated Member or Semi-Retired Designated Member:

Practicing Semi-Retired Designated Member

A Practicing Semi-Retired Designated Member is a Designated Member in good standing who is at least sixty (60) years of age and earns no more than \$25,000 in each calendar year from Valuation Practice as defined by the Code of Professional Ethics. The Board of Directors shall establish such dollar amount from time to time.

Practicing Life Designated Members

A Practicing Life Designated Member is a Designated Member in good standing who has held Designated membership in the Appraisal Institute or its predecessor organizations continuously for at least forty (40) years and is current in the payment of full membership dues. A Practicing Life Designated Member who was terminated from membership for any reason (including resignation) may not be readmitted with Life Designated Member status unless readmission occurs within one (1) year of the date of termination.

Non-Practicing Designated Member

A Non-Practicing Designated Member is a Designated Member in good standing who is not engaged in Valuation Practice as defined by the Code of Professional Ethics. Some Non-Practicing Designated

Members may also hold the status of Retired Designated Member or Life Designated Member:

Non-Practicing Retired Designated Members

A Non-Practicing Retired Designated Member is a Designated Member in good standing who is at least sixty (60) years of age and who is not engaged in Valuation Practice as defined by the Code of Professional Ethics.

Non-Practicing Life Designated Members A Non-Practicing Life Designated Member is a Designated Member in good standing who has held Designated membership in the Appraisal Institute or its predecessor organizations continuously for at least forty (40) years and is current in the payment of full membership dues. A Non-Practicing Life Designated Member who was terminated from membership for any reason (including resignation) may not be readmitted with Life Designated Member status unless readmission occurs within one (1) year of the date of termination.

PAREA: Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal – Registration is Open

On September 12, the Appraisal Institute announced that the organization's Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal program (Al PAREA) for the licensed residential path has launched broadly, and registration is now open.

The Appraisal Foundation's Board of Trustees awarded the Pathway to Success Grant to the Appraisal Institute to assist with the development of the PAREA program. The Pathway to Success Conditional Grant is designed to open up the appraisal profession to a new generation of appraisers and stipulates that participant priority be given to veterans, minorities and those in designated rural areas. Al was awarded the full grant amount of \$500,000 to build its AI PAREA program in collaboration with its partners. Al committed more than \$2 million toward AI PAREA.

After receiving approval from the Appraiser Qualifications Board in May, Al PAREA initially welcomed select participants who had completed their Qualifying Education & reside in a state which has fully accepted PAREA in lieu of the traditional supervisor/ trainee model during the pilot program phase.

Al PAREA, which is an online program, is an alternative pathway for aspiring appraisers to gain their required experience hours to become a licensed or certified appraiser, using a standardized approach. Historically, the only option for an appraiser to complete their experience hours was through a supervisor/trainee model that requires the aspiring appraiser to find their own supervisor. With the Al PAREA program, participants can appraise properties

virtually with one-on-one guidance from a mentor who is an Appraisal Institute Designated Member to help navigate the path to credentialing. Each mentor will answer questions, offer constructive feedback and help participants to develop the problem-solving skills necessary throughout an appraiser's career.

"The AI PAREA program will create tremendous opportunities for aspiring appraisers to meet the experience requirements and open a pathway to entering this respected and rewarding profession," said Appraisal Institute President Craig Steinley, MAI, SRA, AI-GRS, AI-RRS. Key elements of AI PAREA:

- Participants will be supported throughout the program by mentors with years of real-world experience who are Appraisal Institute Designated Members and full-time employees of the organization. The Appraisal Institute specifies rigorous requirements for Designated membership regarding experience, education and moral character and those individuals demonstrate the highest standards of education and ethics.
- Al PAREA participants will have access to the organization's 66 chapters to enhance networking opportunities & connect with appraisers who can potentially help participants become geographically competent, meaning participants can learn about the specifics of local markets from appraisers with that knowledge & experience.
- In addition to the basic specification of three USPAP-compliant reports established for PAREA programs by the AQB, AI PAREA features an additional 10 practice assignments and reports. The assignments are consistent for all participants and include a variety of complexity and property types to reinforce important appraisal concepts and skills
- Assignments that are part of AI PAREA are developed by an organization with a 90+ year history of creating best-in-class education, publications & other appraisal products.
- AI PAREA participants have access to a knowledge center that includes a variety of resources that appraisers use every day including forms software, cameras, GIS, measuring and sketch tools, data services and a multiple listing service (MLS).

New Book: The Appraisal of Senior Housing, Nursing Home, and Hospital Properties

This comprehensive text explores senior housing, nursing home, and hospital properties from physical and economic perspectives, providing appraisers with an up-to-date set of tools for determining the productivity, marketability, feasibility, and value of these facilities. Readers will become familiarized with the forces affecting earnings and valuation and will gain knowledge of the techniques needed to assist in the acquisition, lending, investing, developing, and assessment of these properties. Because of the broad

scope of topics covered, many nonappraisers—including lenders, equity investors, operators, developers, industry analysts, assessors, and attorneys—will find this book useful.

All three traditional approaches to value are closely examined in this book, and Medicare and Medicaid are also discussed in detail. The main focus of the book is the valuation of the going concern assuming a fee simple interest in the real property. In addition, techniques for the allocation of the value of the real property, personal property, and intangible property are covered along with specialized topics such as leased fee and leasehold interests and life plan communities.
